# Our Fundraisers

## 15th Annual Home Design Tour

"How Long Beach Lives" was the theme of the annual Home Design Tour, which took place on May 12, 2019. Under a veil of sunshine, more than 400 people paraded through five fabulous homes helping to raise some \$43,000 through ticket sales and generous sponsors, including Marlene Temple, Judy McNulty Black and Don Black, Nancy Foster Williams Foundation, and Bill and Elaine Ross. Event Co-

Chairs Elizabeth Borsting and Erin Barry selected the featured homes—all very distinct from one another. They included the Net Zero Nest, an eco-friendly abode in Alamitos Heights producing as much energy as it uses. The Spanish Beauty in Belmont Heights, a new home with modern amenities but the graceful architecture of a 1920s classic California dwelling, was jaw-dropping. Golf cart limousines ferried guests to Treasure Island and a reimagined Beach Retreat overlooking the canals complete with rooftop bar. And, finally, the piece de resistance was the iconic Gaytonia in Belmont Heights. Preservationist Robert Thomas, who owns the entire castle-like apartment building, welcomed guests into his penthouse where Champagne and a playlist of Torch Songs were enjoyed on the expansive terrace. Following the tour, ticket holders were invited to an alfresco garden party at the Park Estates home of

Anthony Gagliardi where a buffet lunch, wine and spirits, live entertainment, opportunity drawings, an auction and a pop-up boutique awaited.

## Gatsby on the Green

The Virginia Country Club home of Dr. Marlene
Temple and Craig Carter was transformed into a
1920s speakeasy for Steel Magnolias' annual
Signature Event featuring a 1920's twist. Gatsby on
the Green took place in the early evening of Sunday,
September 15, 2019. Event Chair and Chairman of
the Steel Magnolias' Board Anthony Gagliardi did a



fabulous job in recreating a Boardwalk Empire-style fete complete with a performance by the Satin Dollz along with a wisecracking ventriloquist and music from the era. Guests were shuttled to the undisclosed location and had to utter a password in order to get past the imposing gates, gun-toting gangsters and fleet of vintage automobiles. The Roaring Twenties was a fitting theme for the event as it marked Steel Magnolias 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary. ## Rally Round Golf Tournament

Underneath a veil of blue skies and airbrushed clouds golfers gathered at Old Ranch Country Club for

the annual Rally Round Golf Tournament sponsored by Mohammad Raghib, along with Lynn Gesner and Chair Dane Hickerson. The event, which took place October 28, 2019, raised more than \$90,000 – a record-setting event as well as a fore-star event on the fairways. Just before the official tee-off, golfers gathered on the green for the inaugural Dressed to a Tee contest where judges looked for the most innovative tee togs. Then Jamie Mulligan, Head Golf Professional & CEO of Virginia Country Club and women's golf tour professional, Veronica Filbert, provided an instructional golf clinic. All watching were amazed at the distance and accuracy which can be obtained by coordinating proper golf swing elements and mechanics. Golfers then put the pedal to the metal as a parade of golf carts scattered in all directions for an afternoon of golf and goodwill. Local restaurants, including Naples Rib Co., Santa Fe Importers, E.J's Pub, Raising Cane's, The Crooked Duck and Joe Jost's, provided on-course hospitality at designated holes throughout the day. A taco buffet and awards ceremony, along with both a live and silent auction, awaited golfers as they stowed away their clubs for some 19<sup>th</sup> hole socializing.

You wouldn't know it from this photo, but social interactions and communication haven't always been easy for Leona, age 9. She was diagnosed with autism at the Stramski Children's Developmental Center at Memorial Care Miller Children's & Women's Hospital Long Beach when she was in pre-school. Says her mom, Courtney. "When she was diagnosed, it was hard to know what to do next, but the Stramski Center has been there for our family and supported us along the way." The staff works with Leona to keep up with developmental milestones, social interactions and the adjustment to elementary school. These days, Leona loves to act in community plays, swim, dance and hang out with friends. "The Stramski Center has helped me find support from my community, know what questions to ask when it comes to school, and helped my daughter find the confidence needed to discover activities she loves, like theater. Leona has become an inspiration for her family and her community," says Courtney. "She has grown and progressed so much, she's really blossomed on stage and in the classroom."

The creative class of 2020 – Sue DeRosa, Michele Dobson, Bobbie Fesler and Heidi Van Horn – developed a virtual fundraiser - a fun 3 nights of mixology lessons followed by bingo for bragging rights only! The outcome was fun and raised over \$4,300.

LB Gives became this year's main event. We are thankful to LB Gives for giving the community a way to raise funding when we couldn't do events and appreciate all of you who responded. Thanks to leadership gifts, your donations and members gifts we exceeded our \$50,000 goal. We were 5th out of over 100 nonprofits and ultimately raised close to \$60,000.

The year isn't over for Steel Magnolias. As we continue to raise funding in the final weeks of 2020, we hope you will consider taking the enclosed envelope and making a year-end gift. It will make a meaningful and long-term difference in a challenged child's life.
